Guildford Model Yacht Club invite you to our Afternoon Lunch Events on alternative Wednesdays. These allow you to have lunch at home, have a really good afternoon sail on our fantastic lake at Abbey Meads, Chertsey and return home in time for supper. There is no entry fee to take part in the racing, which may also include sail setting sessions, starting practice, novelty races etc as appropriate. You may join the racing at any time.

Abbey Meads is a superb large open sailing water, ideal for radio racing with courses always close to either the western or southern control areas, on both of which you can park your car. You can 'walk the banks' high above the water to the furthest marks of the long windward leeward courses, which give you fantastic visibility for the very best racing. Guildford members will help you get your boat up and down the steps to the water, if required.

At some points during the series there will be 'real ALE'!

We invite you to try out our lake and whilst we would like to see more Marbleheads on the water, it is just as suitable for 10 raters. All classes are welcome, but if you don't have a Marblehead and would like to try sailing one of these the superb machines, you would be most welcome to borrow one; just ring Roger on 07507 405 799. Guildford's water at ABBEY MEADS lake is easy to find. Follow the brown signs to THORPE PARK and go to the roundabout at their entrance. Travel south on the A320 towards Chertsey. After a few hundred yards turn left off the road, where signposted 'Chertsey Water Treatment Works' and where you should see a sign, RADIO SAILING. If you arrive whilst we are racing, dial 1617 on the black number padlock and press the button at the bottom to open the gate and close it behind you.
