'NYLET' RM Challenge

This trophy was originally donated by Nylet's Frank Parsons, at the very beginning of radio Marblehead racing in 1974. Hidden for some years, it has been re-established & will be presented by Frank at the end of the series. The best 2 GAMES scores of the Series will determine this trophy's winner.



The Guildford race team warmly welcome you the final event in the Summer Series and will do our best to give you a great day's racing & lots of fun!

Current IMCA Marblehead class rules will apply and the racing will be governed by the current RRS, as modified by the current MYA Standard Sailing Instructions with the addition of the IRSA Short Penalty, and HMS. Relevant notices are:

REGISTRATION - 0845 to 0930 hours

BRIEFING - this will start at approximately 0945 hours.

RACING TIMES - the first race will start soon after the briefing at approximately 1000 hours - no race will start after 1530 hours and any race in progress at 1600 hours will be abandoned. Please present the relevant boat certificate & PSN certificate at the control table. Be prepared to have your boat checked against the length/depth measurement gauge at registration. There will be a break for lunch to enjoy a barbecue and a chat before starting the afternoon racing.

The entry fee is £10 to be paid on the day. Please enter using the MYA online entry system with a deadline of midnight on Thursday 13th June. If you would like to come and join us and help create some fun, do not leave your entry to the last minute and **ENTER NOW**. If you are not sure, still enter and withdraw your entry later if there is a problem. In addition to these trophies, you will also be racing for GMYC's usual interesting variety of prizes. For those who have not been to our lake before, you will find Abbey Meads Lake easily, if you follow these instructions. From which ever direction you are travelling, follow the brown signs to THORPE PARK and go to the roundabout at their entrance. Then travel south on the A320 towards Chertsey and you may see the lake behind the hedge on your left. After a few hundred yards turn left off the road, where signposted 'Chertsey Water Treatment Works' and park in front of the gate. **If the gate is locked, the circular number padlock has had the number scrambled, so change the number to the familiar 1617 to open the padlock. Remove the bar attached to the other lock on the chain and slide back the locking bar to open the gate. Once through the gate, repeat this process in reverse and ALWAYS scramble the number. Do not leave the padlock insecure at 1617.** If you want help ring the number on the welcome notice above the locks on the gate, but remember that we may be busy out on the lake laying the marks so please be patient. If all else fails just sit on your horn! Any queries please ring Roger on 01483 421801.
